

A SIMPLE TEST TO DETECT CERVICAL CANCER EARLY

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Cervical Cancer is one of the most common cancers among Indian women. "This cancer at an early stage is detectable, preventable and curable. As cervical cancer doesn't show any symptoms at an early stage, it is advisable for women over 30 years, who have been sexually active at any stage in life, to undergo regular Pap tests from a reliable centre, once in every three years, to help detect precancerous lesions before cervical cancer develops," says Dr Anbukkani Subbian, DGO, DNB, MRCOG (UK) Fellow in Gynecologic Oncology.

She adds that the commonly identified symptoms of cervical cancer are present only in the advanced stages of illness.

SYMPTOMS OF CERVICAL CANCER

- Irregular menstrual periods
- Bleeding after menopause

- Bleeding after intercourse
- Foul-smelling or increased vaginal discharge
- Persistent bleeding in between periods
